



Deacon's Diary

Did you ever notice that when your day seems to be hectic and starts to unravel, one thing after the other begins to pile up until at last you find it hard to make even simple decisions come out right? Every time I read the passage from Saint James in our second reading this weekend, it reminds me of a day I had like that.

The passage from Saint James reads: "What good is it, my brothers and sisters if someone says he has faith but does not have works. Can that faith save him? If your brother or sister [is in need]

and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace, keep warm and eat well,' but you do not give them what they need, what good is that?"

Let's flash back to a day like I described above when I was in the automobile repair business about 23 years ago. A young man and woman came to me needing a ride to their car which was near Sheboygan and needed a starter motor put on which they had purchased elsewhere. Well, it was almost my lunchtime so I tried calling a couple of people I know who may have been able to give them a ride, but couldn't make any connections. Finally in desperation I invited them to wait on the corner and possibly catch a ride with someone going that way. Pretty lame, huh?



Not only that, but as I was leaving to grab some lunch, I said to them: "Go in peace and good luck."

After I had time to think about what I said it bothered me. But then, when I came back, it was too late. They were gone. By trying to keep my own agenda on task, I missed an opportunity to serve Jesus in others. I wonder how many times I repeated that missed opportunity that I'm not aware of. How many times have I said: "Good bye and good luck," or maybe said nothing at all when a kind word was all that was needed.

Relationships are built bit by bit, not all at once. The gospel reading from Mark for this weekend has Jesus asking: "Who do you say that I am?" Peter immediately responds: "You are the Christ." This response is in contrast to some of his first words which were:

"Depart from me, for I am a sinful man." Jesus allowed Peter to build a relationship with him and letting him declare through that relationship that He was the Christ. But, that couldn't happen until Peter admitted his own faults and failings. He had to leave his agenda and follow Him.

And, that's the way we will be able to see more clearly who Christ is. Jesus went on to say: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny [themselves], take up [their] cross, and follow me." At times we must leave our agenda in the past to see Christ in the poor, the lonely, the disadvantaged. It's when we can see Him there, that our eyes will be opened to understand better how He is able to come to us in a piece of bread and a cup of wine.

This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it!
