Cup O' Joe

Weekly Reflections by Joseph Zenk, Pastoral Leader

When I was young, I really didn't care for my first name. Joe. I mean, c'mon. It was as common of a name as one could get. One syllable. You could spit it out w/out even really thinking. Two syllables or more? I could only imagine. You had to work to say them. FRAN-cis. Ma-RI-a. AN-dre. Man, to have a multisyllabic name would have been the bee's knees to me. I watched Petticoat Junction growing up. I saw Uncle Joe (movin' kinda slow) and he didn't impress me too much. I even ate a sandwich named after me (Sloppy Joes - you may know it here as a Hot Tamale which, truth be told, makes very little sense to me) and frankly, I didn't much care for it. Joe? Way too ordinary.

But as I grew older, my love affair with the name grew - because of one person. The character we read about in today's Gospel.

We know very little of Joseph, the husband of Mary. He is not named at all in the Gospel of Mark. John's Gospel names him, but only as a title for Jesus, such as "the son of Joseph". What little we know of Joseph comes from Matthew and Luke in their infancy narratives - such as today's reading. And what we find deserves notice.

Imagine being betrothed (engaged) to someone and you find that they are with child (sorry women - this game of imagination only works one-sided I guess). And you know that child is not yours. How do you

react?

Joseph reacts with kindness and compassion, even in the midst of hurt and what seems to be incredible disrespect. Unwilling to expose this woman and shame her for what she has done, he decides to divorce her quietly. Live and let live. Go their separate ways.

If that was the end of the story, that still is deserving of our respect. Someone who could have been shamed and stripped of their dignity - or worse, killed! - was left, dignity intact to go about their life. But it wasn't the end. Joseph, like the one in Genesis for which he was named, was a dreamer. And he listened.

When God came calling and invited Joseph into a new place - beyond his emotions and hurt and logic and understanding - he didn't put up an argument. He didn't try to rationalize his behavior. He didn't shun the request and go his own way. Instead, "he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home."

Humility. Compassion. Dignity. Listener. Courageous. Yeah, I still may not like how quickly my name can come off a tongue. But being named after a man who embodies the above mentioned values? That I can be proud of. That challenges me - and all of us! - to carry the name well.

Please take note of this notice from the Diocese: In order to comply with IRS reporting requirements regarding 2016 donations, all donations and stewardship envelopes **received** on Saturday, December 31 in the offertory collection will be recorded in the 2016 tax year. Stewardship envelopes and donations received on Sunday, January 1, 2017 in the offertory collection will not qualify for a charitable deduction in 2016, even if the check was written in 2016 or was back-dated to 2016. They will be applied to the 2017 tax year.

To make sure donations for the 2016 tax year are applied correctly, get them in early.
