Weekly Reflections by Joseph Zenk, Pastoral Leader

You may recall that last weekend's Gospel was the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert. But it began by Jesus coming out of the Jordan and his experience of God following his baptism. Luke captures that event as follows:

"After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."" (Luke 3:21-22)

In Matthew's Gospel, this event happens just as Jesus was coming up out of the water. But not in Luke. In Luke, God's voice is heard while Jesus was in prayer, for it's in prayer that the heavens open.

I bring that up because we see the same thing happening in today's Gospel reading – the story of the Transfiguration. Jesus takes his inner circle – Peter, James, John – up the mountain to pray. *"While he was praying, his face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white."*

While he was praying. Jesus didn't just walk around Galilee and have crazy and strange things happen to him while close to rivers and mountains. He was a man of prayer and because of that, God was made known to him. Because of that, Jesus was able to hear God's voice. Because of that, Jesus' outer look took on the same form as that which was inside of him. He became dazzling white.

But it wasn't just Jesus on the mountain top with Moses and Elijah. He also had his close friends who, the Gospel

reminds us, were overcome by sleep. Instead of spending time in the work of prayer and thus, opening themselves to God's presence, they chose to relax. To be comfortable. To sleep.

Now let me get something straight here – I'm pro relaxation and comfort! There is nothing wrong with those two items... unless, that is, they keep us from God's movement within and among us. If comfort is what we seek, then comfort becomes an end in itself, rather than a welcome rest-stop on our journey of faith.

Shortly after our sleepy friends arise, the following happens:

"While (Peter) was still speaking, a cloud came and cast a shadow over them, and they became frightened when they entered the cloud." And because of this fear, they did not tell anyone of what they had experienced.

So what are we to take from all of this? How does this impact our Lenten journey?

1. I think it invites us to imitate Jesus by being people of prayer. Recall, the three pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Prayer is the tool that allows us, just as it allowed Jesus, to hear the voice of God. It is by becoming a community and individuals of prayer that our outsides will slowly but surely become dazzling white, reflecting God's presence within us.
2. We are also the apostles who, at various times of our lives, can become sleepy and comfortable. Lent, by its very nature, invites us to wake up. The cloud of unknowing that we call the future invites us all to step within it. It can't be avoided. We can be frightened of it, or we can go in wide awake to the fact that our God accompanies us on the journey. Even though we can't see what lies ahead, we know we are secure in the arms of the one who continues to speak to us through prayer.

Lenten Regulations

Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent and Good Friday.

In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may only eat one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
