

## Deacon's Diary

Two men were marooned on an island. One man paced back and forth worried and scared while the other man sat back and was sunning himself. The first man said to the second man, "aren't you afraid we are about to die." "No," said the second man, "I make \$100,000 a week and tithe faithfully to my church every week. My Pastor will find me."

These past three weeks we have been focusing on the three pillars of stewardship; prayer, service, and giving. On this final week of October we are encouraged to make commitments in those areas. Sometimes when we prayerfully consider what we may be comfortable with giving, we soon find ourselves stressing how we can continue at those levels.

God understands that life has many demands, and when we have committed to tithe and spend six minutes every hour in prayer, he knows we need some of the day to sleep. We need that time to rest and recover. But, every day can be a living prayer.

If you promised to commit one-tenth of your day in service to God, your church, or others, God is realistic knowing we may be spending some of that time earning a living. Yet, even there we can find ways to help make our co-workers day better.

If we find it impossible to take ten percent off the top of our earnings before taxes, and write a check each week to the church for that amount, you're not alone. Although, I do know some people who do that and find it very liberating. They who do that have told me: "It makes them feel unattached to the material things."

When we make an effort to live our life

unattached to material wealth, we are able to understand that everything we have is a gift. We can understand everything belongs to God and we are only here for a short time as stewards of those gifts. Our care and distribution of those gifts are our mission in life.

I recently read a story that may help us to stay focused on our commitment to be good stewards. A man in the church once made a covenant with a former pastor to tithe ten percent of their income every year. They were both young and neither of them had much money. But things changed. The layman tithed one thousand dollars the year he earned ten thousand, ten thousand dollars the year he earned one-hundred thousand, and one-hundred thousand dollars the year he earned one million. But the year he earned six million dollars he just could not bring himself to write out that check for six-hundred thousand dollars to the Church. He telephoned the minister, long since having moved to another church, and asked to see him. Walking into the pastor's office the man begged to be let out of the covenant, saying, "This tithing business has to stop. It was fine when my tithe was one thousand dollars, but I just cannot afford six-hundred thousand dollars. You've got to do something, Reverend!" The pastor knelt on the floor and prayed silently for a long time. Eventually the man said, "What are you doing? Are you praying that God will let me out of the covenant to tithe?" "No," said the minister. "I am praying for God to reduce your income back to the level where one thousand dollars will be your tithe!"  
(Not quite what he had in mind)
