Cup O' Joe

Weekly Reflections by Joseph Zenk, Pastoral Leader

Readings just don't get any better than this weekend. They just don't. So what is so good about them? Because they are honest – both in who we are and who God is.

First reading – the Exodus story. The people have just been freed, Moses has gone up the mountain and the people, left below, are getting anxious. Their leader has been gone too long. They feel alone and worry for their future. So they build a golden calf – a god that they can see, feel and touch. They trade in the wonder and vastness and ineffability and magnanimity of God for something far too small and inconsequential. Sound familiar?

So what does God do? Well, if we take the reading literally, He throws a fit. God wants to start over but Moses talks Him out of it. God looks like a petulant child who is dragged to mercy against His will. Again – does this sound familiar? Is that our image of God? That He has to be talked into mercy? We must know that that understanding of God is an early one in the life of the Hebrew people. I suspect it was probably exactly the other way around.

How can I say that? Because Jesus said it first. And if Jesus really is the image of the invisible God, as Paul says, just what does His image look like? It's like a shepherd who leaves 99 sheep and goes off in search of one.

It's like a woman who loses a coin and will not stop cleaning until she finds it. It's like a man who loses a son and will not stop looking down the road until he sees him once again.

And what does he do when he sees him? He runs! He runs to embrace him. To cover him with a new robe and dignity. He gives him a ring and in doing so, his name.



His forgiveness is present even before a word is out of the boy's mouth. And in calling for a party, the father restores the son's place within the family and within the community. It's clear that what sin does is separates. Otherwise why all the imagery of a sheep, a coin and a son? But it's also clear that love unites – and that is what our God's mission is.

Unity.

Paul says in the second reading that he is a sinner. Period. But he also says that "this saying is trustworthy and deserves our full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners." Not to destroy them. Not to punish them. To save them.

So the question for us is – do we give Paul's statement our full acceptance? Or do we still feel a need to talk God into mercy?

Mercy Message

Father Vincent Capodanno was a Navy Chaplain serving the Marines in combat during the Vietnam war. He was there for them in their greatest hour of need. He would often stay with the wounded and dying counseling them, praying with them, offering hope, comfort, and encouragement. On Sept. 4, 1967, while wounded and unarmed, he shielded a wounded soldier from gunfire, sacrificing his own life.

While our sacrifice when comforting, encouraging, and giving hope to others, may not require our ultimate sacrifice as it did for Fr. Capodanno, the benefits for the recipient might be just as dramatic.
