Cup O' Joe

Weekly Reflections by Joseph Zenk, Pastoral Leader

This past week, I finished two books - one I had been working on for quite some time and one was really a quick read. I recommend both to you.

The quick read is entitled *The Prodigal God* by Timothy Keller, an evangelical minister. The entire premise of Keller's book is breaking down the well-known parable by Jesus in Luke 15 which we call the Prodigal Son. He spends most of his time comparing and contrasting the two sons - how both had journeyed far from their Father's heart and home, but in very different ways.

The younger son chooses what Martin Luther would call "sinning boldly." He purposefully and with full knowledge leaves behind the Father and everything he stands for. The second son uses a much different tactic and what makes this approach so insidious is that it is very possible he didn't even realize he was doing it. Instead of leaving, the older son uses his good works as a way of establishing rights and control over the Father. In a sense, he uses his good works as a way of distancing himself from the Father. At the end of the story, both are invited into the banquet. We only know of one, however, that has entered.

Both this book and Henri Nouwen's excellent work *The Return of the Prodigal Son* do a great job of bringing that marvelous parable to life.

My other recently finished book is entitled *Sacred Fire* by Fr. Ron Rolheiser, an Oblate of Mary Immaculate who writes a weekly column featured in *The Compass*, our weekly diocesan paper.

Sacred Fire is a follow up to his exceptional

earlier work *The Holy Longing* (which, if you have not read, I highly recommend.) Rolheiser states that *The Holy Longing* was meant for Christians just beginning the path of discipleship. *Sacred Fire*, however, was written for Christians who are mature and are looking for ways to give their life away. Toward the end of the book, he leaves the reader with 10 commandments for mature Christian living. He fleshes them out more in the book and each one deserves its own column. I highly recommend this book for all who are looking for ways to live their faith and give their lives away to God and others. Here are his commandments:

1. Live in gratitude and thank your Creator by enjoying your life.
2. Be willing to carry more and more of life's complexities with empathy
3. Transform jealousy, anger, bitterness and hatred rather than give them back in kind
4. Let suffering soften your heart rather than harden your soul
5. Forgive - those who hurt you, your own sins, the unfairness of your life, and God for not rescuing you.
6. Bless more and curse less
7. Live in a more radical sobriety
8. Pray, affectively and liturgically
9. Be wide in your embrace
10. Stand where you are supposed to be standing, and let God provide the rest.

WINTER MAP TESTING RESULTS

The Winter testing session of the Measures of Academic Progress have been completed for the students of Divine Savior Catholic School.

- Grades 5K-8 tested in Reading with 207 subtests. 96% were average to high.
- Grades 5K-8 tested in Math with 212 subtests. 89% were average to high.
- Grades 3-8 tested in Language with 96 subtests. 98% were average to high.
- Grades 5-8 tested in Science with 57 subtests. 100% were average to high.

Overall, the students completed 572 subtests with 539 scoring in the average to high category for a 94% achievement score.

Students meet weekly on an individual basis with a teacher to monitor academic progress and set learning goals for the upcoming week.
