# Cup O' Joe

Weekly Reflections by Joseph Zenk, Pastoral Leader

Many people think the Christmas season ends when the kings arrive on Epiphany. And frankly, it's hard to argue with them this year. Last Sunday, the church was all decorated for Christmas and here we are this Sunday with the church looking ordinary once again. Yes, we are back in Ordinary Time.

But the season of Christmas actually ends with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Usually that particular feast is celebrated on the weekend following Epiphany, but due to the timing of how Christmas fell this year (on a Sunday), Baptism of the Lord was just tucked in this past Monday.

That doesn't stop us, however, from hearing about Jesus' baptism this weekend. In each of the Gospel's, Jesus earthly ministry *begins with his baptism*. John's Gospel only alludes to His baptism, but we hear about that allusion this weekend. John the Baptist said he "saw the Spirit come down like a dove from heaven and remain upon him." John's Gospel is hoping that imagery calls to mind the baptism of Jesus in the three Synoptic Gospels.



It's good for us to reflect not only upon the baptism of Jesus but also our own baptism because in truth, that same Spirit comes to rest upon us in a

similar manner. We may not have seen the heavens rend and a dove descend, but we rise no less a new creation when we come out of the waters. And that action begins our ministry no less than it did Jesus' ministry.

So in celebrating Jesus baptism and call to ministry, we celebrate our own ministries and callings. We remember that in our baptism, God set us aside for our own special mission, wherever that would take us. It may not be something that gets written down in Gospels, as Jesus' ministry was. It may not be something heroic and therefore won't end up on the nightly news or in the paper. But it certainly will be something that finds its way into serving and helping the lives of those around us.

Often times in obituaries, we see the date a person died and the saying that their loved one was "born into eternal life" on that particular date. It's a beautiful thought...but it's somewhat incorrect. We are born into the life of God - and, therefore into eternal life - on the day of our baptism. That's the day we rise a new creation! That's what kick starts our ministry! That reminds us that we are beloved in the same way Jesus was! So now you see why that really does deserve its own feast day.

Similarly, Jesus calls us to follow him and live as his faithful disciples each day. Do we have the faith and courage to answer his call?
