Deacon's Diary

Last week Saturday members of our three linked parishes went to Green Bay to listen to a talk by Matthew Kelly, a well known author of many books that are on the New York Times' "Best Selling List." You may remember his name from some of the books we've given as Christmas gifts at Mass in the past. Or, you may remember hearing his Australian accent from the many CD's given away. You may also have subscribed to his "Best Lent Ever" email through his company, "Dynamic Catholic." His lectures/talks are very entertaining, and at the same time thought-provoking.

The subject of this particular lecture was titled, "Living Every Day With Passion and Purpose." He started out stating that a study had been done to identify what was the main thing that "sucked the life" out of any company or organization. He said: "The biggest drain on resources of time and money are the 'Q & S' people. That is, those people that quit but stay." In other words, those people who don't have a passion for their reason for being there.

He continued by reminding us about all the great things the Catholic Church does in the world. He said: "The Catholic Church feeds more people, clothes more people, and houses more people, educates more people, and heals more people than any other organization in the world. However, the Catholic Church in America is dying a very rapid death." He went on to remind us how the decline in attendance and reception of the Sacraments is like a wound that is hemorrhaging. He stated percentages that prove this, and those numbers are far worse in Europe. He predicted that if something didn't change here in the USA, we would be looking at those same numbers in five years.

I share his message with you in my column not to discourage anyone, but to remind myself and anyone else who may have taken the time to read this; **this situation will not change unless each one of us builds the passion in ourselves to be transformed.** All of us can look at anyone else with a critical eye, but we can't change others, only ourselves. Each of us must develop a "Game Changer" in ourselves to fully

embrace the passion that will make a difference. If all we do is complain how others are letting this situation take place without doing something to make that happen, I believe Jesus will be "just" to hold each of us accountable for it.

Kelly made three points in his talk to help us make these necessary changes which I shared with Holy Rosary and St. Ann in my homily last weekend. But, to restate them on paper may help some of us to refer back to them again and again.

Point #1; take each weekend's gospel with us as we leave and try to live that gospel message 100% during the following week. In other words, if the pearl or theme of the gospel is, "love your enemy," try to do that all week for those people who irritate or frustrate us.

Point #2; go to Confession, (Reconciliation) once every month. Every person that wants to be the best they can be at something, listens to their coach and tries to do everything he or she tells them. No one ever achieved great things by pointing out everyone else's flaws while overlooking their own. Monthly Confession is a game changer.

Point #3; hunger for Mass and the Eucharist. Many people say they don't come to Mass anymore because it's boring, irrelevant to today's world, and doesn't do anything to solve the problems in our world. Maybe that's because the solution to solving the world's problems stays in the building when we leave. It stays on the page in the Book of the Gospels, or the sheet music we sang with the choir, (or didn't sing), or in the Tabernacle behind the altar. We are encouraged to bring a note pad or a ledger with us to Mass, identify one thing at the Mass that really touched us, (a song, Scripture, homily, prayer) write it down and reflect on it every day during the week.

If all of us would try to do these things, we would experience changes not only in ourselves, but in our spouse, family, church, community, country, "C"hurch, and the world. *"This could be the day the Lord has made better, let us rejoice and be glad in it."*


