Deacon's Diary

You may have noticed a lot of hype in the Catholic News networks, in both the electronic and print, about the 100th Anniversary of Mary, (the mother of Jesus) appearing to the three children of Fatima, Portugal. For those of you who may not be familiar with the events surrounding those apparitions, see the "Cup o' Joe" column in the bulletin from May 7th, 2017.

This past week I was reading the "National Catholic Register" and the many articles about Fatima just loaded with different information about the visionaries and events surrounding the apparitions. As you may have noticed, I am often captivated by unusual tidbits of information, and there was one article in particular that I found very interesting.

That article was a commentary by the Senior Editor of "The Register" Matthew E. Bunson titled; "Mary's Providential Bridge to Islam." The article pointed to the fact that the name of the city, [Fatima] is actually a well respected Muslim name. Fatima was the name of Muhammad's favorite daughter who died at the age of 26. The article states that Muhammad's daughter Fatima, "was a woman considered to be of the highest dignity in Islam, save for only one person: the Virgin Mary," (mother of Jesus). After Fatima's death, her father wrote a letter to his dead daughter saying: 'Thou shalt be the most blessed woman in Paradise after Mary.'

The article continues: "It is a surprise to many that Islam has thought so highly of the Blessed Virgin Mary." As a matter of fact, Mary is the only woman named in the Quran, and she is revered as a righteous woman in her own right

and as the most pious, chaste and virtuous woman in history. The Quran affirms the virgin birth, but it also makes clear in its belief that her son was not divine," [but only a great prophet]. In the Muslim's holy book, the expression "Jesus, son of Mary" appears 13 times, while Jesus the Messiah, son of Mary," is found three times. There are also 45 other times in the book that there is a reference to Mary's name.

So, what could this all mean? Could Mary be a bridge to finally put a stop to all the hatred of the extremist Muslim factions that seem determined to put an end to our culture at all costs; even to the point of destroying themselves and anyone else around them? The Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen thought so. To again refer to the article in "The Catholic Register;" "In his 1952 book, "The World's First Love," he devoted a chapter to Mary and the Muslims. He prophetically observed, "At the present time, the hatred of the Moslem countries against the West is becoming a hatred against Christianity itself. ...there is still a grave danger that the power of Islam may return and, with it shake off a West which has ceased to be Christian and affirm itself as a great anti-Christian power."

However, Archbishop Sheen did not despair. "He looked to Fatima and Mary." 'Since nothing ever happens out of Heaven except with a finesse of all details', he wrote: 'I believe that the Blessed Virgin Mary chose to be known as, *Our Lady of Fatima* as a pledge and a sign of hope to the Moslem people, and as an assurance that they will one day accept her Divine Son too.'

Prayer for Graduates

Heavenly Father, surround those who are graduating with your grace.

Bless them with hope so that they move into the future with eager and open hearts.

As they commence with their lives, may they grow ever more grateful and wise.

All of this we ask in the name of Jesus, your beloved Son. Amen.
