Weekly Reflections by Joseph Zenk, Parish Director

I realize that we have only entered into the month of November and the thought of our first snow fall may be weeks away yet – but I suspect that some of those on the east coast thought that before last weekend as well!

In an effort to be prepared, Deacon Pat and I sat down last week to confirm our plan if a snowstorm were to come our way on a weekend. If we find ourselves faced with that situation in the days or months to come, here is how we will respond and here is where you may check to see if Mass will be celebrated at any of our three parishes:

- Deacon Pat, as my eyes here in this area, and I will attempt to make the decision to cancel Mass as early as possible. My goal will be 2 ½ to 3 hours prior to Mass on Saturday or by 6:00 a.m. on Sunday.
- We will contact the parish office managers – Sue, Sue & Kim – who will then change the answering machine at each respective parish to reflect the cancellation.
- We will ask Sue, Sue & Kim to put the information on the home page of each respective parish's website (www.holyrosarynewholstein.org; www.ssppkiel.org; St. Ann, I know we still don't have one – but we hope to change that soon!)
- We will contact the following TV stations with the information – channels 2, 5 & 11.
- We will contact WCUB (980 AM), WHBL (1330 AM) and WLKN (98.1 FM) to notify them of the closing.
- We will also attempt to use email to contact anyone who would like to be notified in this manner. If you would like to be added to an email list to be used only in this manner, please contact Sue, Sue or Kim in the parish office.

Regarding weekday activities and snowfall – if schools are cancelled or released early on any given Wednesday due to the weather, Religious Education will also be cancelled that evening. If the weather causes a delay in school start times, that weekday morning liturgy will also be cancelled.

More than anything else, I just ask you to use your good sense. If you feel unsafe on the roads, stay at home. We can always bring Eucharist to you during the week and would much rather do so than seeing you in harms way. Thanks for your understanding!

On the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011 in all parishes of the United States, will be implementing a new translation of the prayers of the Mass, as found in the Third Edition of the Roman Missal. The next ten weeks we will try to answer some of the questions surrounding the changes.

Do these changes mean that the old translation was not valid and orthodox?

The current translation was approved by the conferences of bishops and confirmed by the Holy See. Until the new text becomes effective, the current translation remains the valid ordinary form of the Liturgy in the Roman Rite. The revised translation attempts to address some inadequacies in the present translation by introducing a more elevated style of language and by retaining many poetic texts and scriptural allusions. The current translation fostered the faith of two generations of Catholics and retains a valid place in church history.

Today's Gospel seems to suggest some limits to hospitality; make sure we are prepared ourselves, even if this means we cannot help others. There is some truth to this – we must attend to our own spiritual lives if we hope to have anything worth giving to others.

In hospitality, we are called to go past our comfort zone; we move beyond ourselves so that others might feel more comfortable, more included. However, we cannot give what we do not have. The wise extend themselves in equal measure to the strength of their relationship with Jesus.

A deeper message today is that none of the virgins stayed awake– no one successfully completes their vigil! And who wants to party (heaven) without our friends and family with us? Jesus tells us we must reach out to our brothers and sisters. We have no choice in this. Ironically, we are called to be wiser than all in today's Gospel. We care for our spiritual lives so that God can work abundantly through us, lighting the oil in everyone's lamps.
